## **Obituary**

Martha M. (Gregg) Huggins took the wings of the morning and departed her earthly sojourn to join that great cloud of witnesses counted among the Redeemed of the Lord. On Thursday, August 6, 2020, she joined her husband of 56 years, Mr. Elvin Huggins, Sr., who proceeded her just a few months earlier in death. Elvin and Martha found true love in their hometown of Bishopville, South Carolina, and from this union of love six children were born, Mr. Calvin Huggins (Schnell), Rev. Dr. Evalina Huggins, Mr. Elvin Huggins, Jr., and Mr. Robert Huggins (Cheronda) and twins who died at birth. Martha's maternal instincts led her and her husband to become Foster Parents to five children and surrogate parents to so many others. Growing up in the rural south, the fourth child of sixteen to the late Mr. Cleveland Gregg, Sr. and Bertha Hickmon Gregg, "Mop" as she was affectionately called learned to cook and clean as she helped to raise her siblings. She attended Dennis High School in Bishopville, South Carolina and received later in her life several Certifications in the area of Food Service and Food Service Delivery, where she used her gift of cooking to bring joy to others.

### HER LIFE'S STORY

Her love for cooking inspired her to begin her culinary career in the Alexandria Public School System, where her children were privileged to drink all of the chocolate milk and eat as many ice cream sandwiches during lunch as they could hold. Her love for food preparation led her to Marino's, Calvert Restaurant, Costco and the Culinary Arts ministry at the North Brentwood and Varick AME Zion Church.

Martha was affectionately known as Mama, Aunt Mop, Ganny, Gana, Martha Mae, Mae, Maude, Miss Prissy, Mother and momma. Blessed with grand-children and great-grands too numerous to count the house was always filled with children, laughter, food and from time to time tears, especially if she had to ask you something more than once. The Huggins home was home for any and everybody. Her specialty was fried chicken, macaroni and cheese, potato salad, and cornbread that taste like cake. Her famous lines were "Get out my kitchen" and "Is your hands clean". She loved to fish, watch SVU and Empire, and hear good singing. She was very close to all of her siblings and wasn't afraid to tell you what she thought. She was Ms. Martha.

### HER CHILDREN AND GRANDS

Like every mother and grandmother she always wanted the best for her family. Willing to go without, there were times she sacrificed and never thought of herself to make sure we all had a clean, happy and healthy home. By today's standards we were poor, but we were happy playing football in the streets, climbing trees, playing hop-scotch and jump rope in the front yard, only to hear her yell from the porch "you better be in this before it gets dark". "Sister" was always daddy's favorite, but those boys belonged to momma's heart. No matter what they did or did not do, she loved her boys unconditionally. And yet, God saw fit for her and her only daughter to watch the transition of her husband, and to be alongside each other as she bid farewell to this world, for a home eternal in the heavens. Her grandchildren were the apple of her eye, and her great-grands brought her unspeakable joy. We are who we are, because of her love.

#### HER CHRISTIAN JOURNEY

While food nourished the physical body, Martha made sure she nourished her spiritual body. She began her spiritual journey at the Ebenezer United Methodist Church, in Bishopville, S.C., but upon relocation to Alexandria, Virginia in 1964, she joined the Alleyne A.M.E. Zion Church in Alexandria, Virginia where her mother and father were founding members. Early on she found her place on the Usher Board, Children's Choir Director, Choir and Culinary Team. When her daughter founded the Beth-El A.M.E. Zion Church, Martha left the Alleyne church in support her ministry. She later followed her daughter to the North Brentwood A.M.E. Zion Church and the Varick Memorial A.M.E. Zion Church. Upon her daughters appointment as Presiding Elder she united with the New Life A.M.E. Zion Church until her death.

### HER LEGACY CONTINUES

Martha is survived by her oldest son Calvin, one daughter the Rev. Dr. Evalina Huggins, Mr. Elvin Huggins, Jr. and her baby "DeDe" – Robert Huggins.
